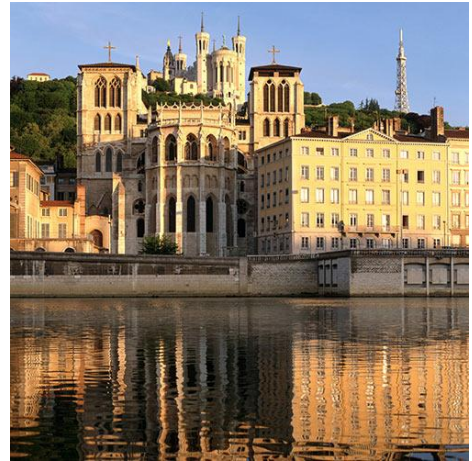

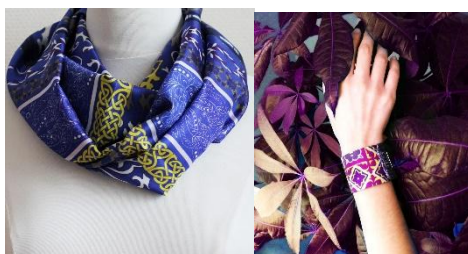
There are a lot of guided visits in Lyon but you can also take the train to visit places around Lyon:
